Credits (0.22); Shots of Arbroath harbour and out to sea (1.04); Map of Scotland's coast, arrow points to the position of the "Abertay" (1.11); Lifeboat crewman runs to the station, and fires two maroons (signal flares) (1.46); General views of the pier as the crew converge on the lifeboat station. Boat is prepared and chains removed, etc. (2.31); Lifeboat is then moved to top of slipway. Crew load on gear and embark. Car drives up. Local doctor alights and puts on a lifejacket. Biography of 'COCOZZA, Enrico'

Amateur film-maker and academic

Born: 1921, November Died: 1997, December, Wishaw

Cocozza, the son of immigrant Italians who ran a cafe in Wishaw, was one of Scotland's most unusual and remarkable film makers. Although an academic by profession he also pursued an 'underground' career making movies. Using amateur casts and crews, and filming in and around his home town in Lanarkshire, he produced films like no other Scot of his generation.

His movies ranged from the strange and surreal Nine O'Clock to the pessimistic social realism of Chick's Day which won the UK Amateur Cine World 'Ten Best competition in 1951. He established the Connoisseur Film Circle with a small auditorium at the rear of the family cafŽ in Wishaw for screening of continental and art films to fellow enthusiasts.

Over some 50 years he produced films both in Scotland during his visits to Italy, observational and reportage of Main Street Wishaw, and a suite of surreal, avant-garde work that often baffled audiences at the Scotlish Amateur Film Festival accustomed to more conventional films. One of the more enduring titles is Glasgow's Docklands made for Educational Films of Scotland.

His was a controversial career blighted later in life by illness that affected his sight.

Details we need from you

- 1. The film(s) title and its reference number. You can find this information in our access catalogue.
- 2. Please tell us why you wish to order a copy of any particular film:
 - Is it for hire or to buy?
 - Is it for personal use, private research, educational use, student project, community, museum or heritage project, charitable purposes, commercial or broadcast
 production, film society or public screening, for example

This is so that we can establish the copyright position and whether it will be necessary to contact a third party rights owner for permission to release the film to you. Sometimes we will be unable to make copies available because of restrictions on the National Library of Scotland under copyright legislation or due to the conditions of deposit.

- 3. What kind of copy do you wish videotape (VHS, Beta SP, Digibeta, Mini-DV) or DVD or a 16mm or 35mm film print? Please note that not all footage can be automatically be copied on to DVD.
- 4. Which country is the copy to be used in? We can make the copy suitable for the television system in use in that country.
- 5. Do you have a particular deadline or date for a showing?

Copying costs and delivery date

Once we have your order we will research what we hold by way of technical material, the copyright position and if we are able to produce the copy to your preferred technical specification.

We will reply to you with an estimate of cost and date for delivery. Cost is based on the running time of the film requested, the kind of copy required and if it is for hire or purchase.

UK Delivery

We despatch all items for delivery to a UK address using Royal Mail first class. Despatch time is usually within 21 days from receipt of order.

European and Rest of World Delivery

We despatch all items for delivery to an address in Europe or the rest of the world using airmail. Despatch time is usually within 21 working days from receipt of order.
